

A name *remembered* in the path itself.

Tribute walkways, memorial gardens, donor recognition — names, dates, and words pressed permanently into the concrete. Nothing is applied to the surface, so the lettering wears with the concrete rather than relying on an applied plaque.

HOW A TRIBUTE IS MADE

01

Choose the words

A name and dates, a line of scripture or verse, a donor's recognition — set at the size and spacing you want.

02

Approve the exact curve

You see a true proof of the letterforms before anything is cut, so the spelling and spacing are settled first.

03

Pressed during the pour

The stamp presses into fresh concrete in about a minute, and the impression becomes part of the panel.
